We'll use of digital cameras, iPhoto '06 and Comic Life 1.3 software, plus cables, card readers & other software as needed.

iPhoto, part of the iLife suite, comes with most Macs or can be purchased/upgraded separately. Use it to import, edit & organize photos. Create electronic albums & slide shows, export to the web, or make books, cards & calendars to print or order from Apple.

Comic Life – use your digital images to make comics, newletters, & more, with text effects, talking bubbles, frames, etc. Download a v1.3 trial (& free upgrade) from www.plasq.com

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Camera Need-to-Know's for Kids (& You)

- ✓ Hold camera steady without covering lens, flash or sensors
- ✓ Turn camera On / Off
- ✓ Snap photo
- ✓ Turn Flash On / Off
- ✓ Zoom In / Out
- ✓ Use Macro for close-ups
- ✓ Press shutter half-way to set focus & light; press all the way to shoot
- ✓ Insert/remove batteries & memory card
- ✓ Move photos to computer with a cable or card reader



Buying Cameras for School

- √ Look for easy-to-use cameras sturdy hinges, well-labeled controls, etc.
- ✓ Ask for a teacher discount!
- √ Compare cameras at www.dpreview.com/ or reviews.cnet.com/
- ✓ Budget for a case, strap, memory card(s) & extra battery pack for each camera.
- √ Buy cameras that can share accessories (cards, batteries, docks, etc.)

Photo Shooting Tips

- ✓ Always wear the strap!
- ✓ Bring extra memory cards & batteries
- ✓ Review photos on the camera & re-shoot!
- ✓ Explore "mistakes" to learn about "good" vs. "bad" shots (head cut off, shaky, finger on the lens, tilted, too dark, etc.)





- ✓ Import to iPhoto iPhoto usually opens every time you connect a camera
- ✓ **Delete** Delete poor shots from the library
- √ Edit rotate, crop & adjust photos



- √ Keywords Create, assign & use keywords for quick searching; for a good tutorial, see allforces.com/2006/03/07/tagging-iphoto/
- ✓ Organize with Albums Dragging photos into an album is the first step in any project
- √ Play a Slide Show Choose an album and click Play, then choose transitions & music.
- ✓ Make a Book, Card or Calendar
- ✓ Export to Web Select an album
- √ From Book to Slide Show For a slide show with text or a few photos per screen, create a book, then play it as a slide show.



- ✓ **Upgrade** Make the (free) upgrade to 1.3
- ✓ Quick Comic Choose an iPhoto album & your settings; Comic Life does all the work!
- √ Pages When you start, choose File > Page Format to set the page size, especially if you plan to make an iPhoto book!
- √ Page tools (lower left) Add, reorder & delete pages
- √ Libraries Browse iPhoto or Finder images
- ✓ Details Add & customize frames, text, 'talking bubbles' & other effects
- √ Style Adjust look of text, frames or photos
- ✓ **Export** to iPhoto, a web page or QuickTime

- √ Recipe or Science Experiment step-by-step expository writing, with photos

- ✓ A Month in Review
- ✓ Famous People Trading Cards
- ✓ Comic Life for blackline masters
