

To access these grades please click on the link to “grades” on my homepage. Once you’re on the Basmati page, you’ll need to select South Eugene High School.

You will be required to enter your student ID number and password. If you can’t remember them, you can email me.

In addition to point values, I use a number of abbreviations in my grade book that you’ll need to understand. Although it may take me awhile to update writing assignment grades, you will easily be able to use these abbreviations to make sure that the work has been turned in. Here are the abbreviations and translations:

E =	excellent (score = 100%)	} (These correspond respectively to the +, √+, √, and – scores on student papers)
G =	great (score = 90%)	
S =	satisfactory (score = 75%)	
U =	unsatisfactory (score = 60%)	

X = assignment has been received but not yet graded, score has no impact on overall class grade at this point

ex = excused (assignment does not need to be completed)

inc = incomplete (student was asked to complete / re-do this assignment; score = 0)

mi = missing (assignment has not been received; score = 0, *this could temporarily be a result of an excused absence and will be corrected when I grade late work.*)

ab = absent (the assignment was missed due to absence, and it needs to be completed and turned in; the score will reflect 0 until then)

Please note that the basmati site incorrectly indicates that a red star () means that the assignment is missing. Ignore that notation. It isn’t connected to anything of mine. It is most likely to show up when I have an assignment in my grade book, but haven’t entered any grades for it yet.*

My hope is that the on-line grade book, in conjunction with the class website, will help ensure students’ success this year. I will do my best to try to post grades every week or two, but posting grades may take a backseat to other planning, preparation, and correcting time constraints. Please be patient.
