



Creating Keynote Movies for iPods

Why Make Movies for Your Students?

- Save time, create tutorials and use them again and again
- Comprehension: Students can replay parts of instructions as many times as needed without anyone knowing
- Absences: Help students who missed the introduction to a new project/unit join the group with the info they need
- Examples: Student/teacher made

How to Make Your Movie

- Create your Keynote file
 - Choose a theme from the theme selector
- Add content
 - Double-click in text boxes to add text
- Add images
 - Choose to add images from the Media Browser or desktop
- Add audio (optional)
 - Click on the Inspector (blue circle with “i”)
 - Record timing
- Export
 - Go to the File menu, then Export
 - Select recorded timing
 - Select iPod size to export
 - Drag the file to iTunes

Integration Ideas

- Instructions for centers and student-run activities
- Rules and expectations
 - Handouts for students to fill in on expectations helps students listen for details
- Instructions for projects
 - Weather demonstrating a 5-paragraph essay or showing proper heading instructions for tools is a great way to help in your class
- Digital comprehension questions
- Digital books by students

Tips

- Text size: Apple + or Apple –
- Easter Eggs
 - Ensure your students have watched by adding a secret message throughout the show
- Screen Shots
 - Add images of applications or your screen to show students where to find what they need
