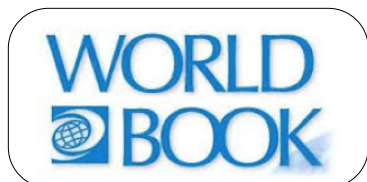

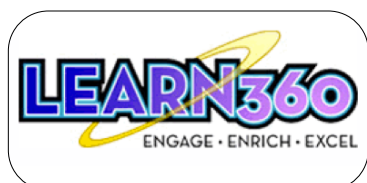
Research tools, biography center, quizzes, citation builders, current events, movie clips, images, and more. Use "Kids" for elementary students and "Student" for upper grades.
