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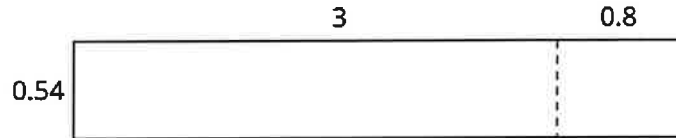

He starts by dividing 62 by 7. In which decimal place should Kiran place the first digit of the quotient (8)?

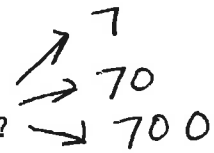
