Welcome to Math 6! We are looking forward to working with your student this year!

### Math Topics/Curriculum

We will use Illustrative Math Curriculum this year. Students will have access to the materials on their iPads (no internet connection needed). There is a link to materials for families for each unit—I will put on my website at the beginning of each of the nine units.

- 1<sup>st</sup> Trimester: Unit 1 Area, Surface Area, Volume; Unit 2 Ratio; Unit 3 Unit Rates and Percent
- 2<sup>nd</sup> Trimester: Unit 4 Dividing Fractions, Unit 5 Arithmetic in Base 10; Unit 6 Expressions and Equations
- 3<sup>rd</sup> Trimester: Unit 7 Rational Numbers; Unit 8Data; Unit 9 Putting it all Together

## Materials

Students are expected to have a section in their binder for Math (or a separate binder). In addition, students have a spiral notebook (I provide) dedicated to math for taking notes and completing other class activities. They should also have a pencil with an eraser.

### Classroom Rules:

- 1. Listen and follow directions
- 2. Raise your hand before speaking or leaving your seat
- 3. Keep hands, feet, and objects to yourself
- 4. Respect your classmates, your teacher, and materials

### Assignments

Students will complete a variety of assignments: class work, homework, and assessments. First trimester grades will be weighted: class work (35%) and homework (10%) and assessments (55%).

#### Homework

Students will have homework Monday-Thursday most weeks. There are two types of problems: *practice* for concepts we are currently working on and *review* of concepts we've learned previously. If students are unable to complete a problem we expect that they have *read the problem* (more than once) and *written down* any information that they know, including drawing a diagram if appropriate. They will also have notes in their spiral they can use as a resource.

## **Getting Help**

# Math 6A Ms. Ruzicka's Expectations

## Beginning of class:

- Enter the room on time, quietly, go to your assigned seat and get ready to do math

- Write in your agenda
- Leave anything in the center of the table alone until you get directions

## **During Class Whole Class Instruction:**

- Think about the problem and contribute to the discussion
- Ask questions
- Please raise your hand and wait to be called on
- Record work/discussion/notes as directed
- If an emergency give Ms. Ruzicka the "sign" for using the restroom or water

## Partner/Group Work:

- Participate actively with your partner/group doing your best to fulfill your assigned role
- LISTEN actively to other members of the group—THINK
- Work on the assigned task with on-task conversation
- Ask questions and make comments respectfully (see poster)

## Business (when I'm not instructing the whole class):

- One person at the drinking fountain
- Wrap your gum in a piece of scratch paper before throwing it out
- Sign out to use the restroom, take pass from the hook and hustle back

# End of Class:

- Look around your table and gather your own belongings. Throw away trash in the garbage container—we have 3 in this room!
